is wonderful all year round in the Water Park! In the summer look out for Hobbies, Sand Martins, orchids, dragonflies and perhaps catch a glimpse of Water Voles and Otters. In winter tens of thousands of waterbirds of 40 different species visit the lakes, including Smew, Goosander and Bittern.

are never far away on any of these cycle routes! On most of the routes the location of the nearest café/pub is mentioned.


Parking...

is available for all routes at our designated car parks. The car parks all have a 2.1m height restriction, so may not be suitable for all types of cycle carrier. Please check clearance before entry/exit.



Road Safety Info...

Wherever possible, these routes utilise the quieter country roads and lanes of the Cotswold Water Park. Busier roads cannot always be avoided, but we have kept these sections to a minimum and have indicated them on the maps. Such routes may not be suitable for young children or complete novices.


